Q. What is a *Green Elephant*?

A. A *Green Elephant* is a pass-along plant: a treasure from your garden that has increased, and which you want to share with other gardeners.

Q. How does the swap work?

A:

- No sales. Just trades and freebies.
- Free Stuff: See plants around the FREE sign.
- Plants on the pavement near vehicles are for trade.
 - Please Do NOT take people's plants.
 - o First talk with the grower.
- Plants inside vehicles are hands off.
- Q. I'm concerned about inadvertently loosing an important plant.
- A. Keep it in your vehicle.
- Q. How do I advertise the plants I have to trade?
- A. Put them on the pavement near your vehicle.
- Q. I have Free Plants to give away.
- A. There's a Free Plants area on the sidewalk toward the office.
- Q. Where are the restrooms?
- A. Inside the church. At either end.
- Q. I've brought Food to trade for plants.
- A. Roving with a container of cookies is a great way to barter for plants. If you have leftovers, they are most welcome at the coffee table in the church.

- Q. Is there something warm to drink?
- A. Check out the coffee in the parish hall of the church..
- Q. Is there any place off limits on the property?
- A. Everyone is welcome everywhere on the property. Please use the playground, visit the Memorial Garden, walk the labyrinth and Stations of the Cross in the back yard.
